WHEREAS, a public hearing was duly held on the 3rd day of February, 1982, and all other matters and things required to be done by the Town Law and the State of New York in order that the Town Board may avail itself of the powers conferred by said laws, having been complied with:

Now, therefore, be it **RESOLVED** and **ORDAINED** by the Town Board of the Town of New Scotland as follows:

AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWN OF NEW SCOTLAND PROVIDING FOR THE ADOPTION AND ENFORCEMENT OF THE NEW YORK STATE FIRE PREVENTION CODE

SECTION I. TITLE

This ordinance shall be known and cited as "An Ordinance of the Town of New Scotland providing for the adoption and enforcement of the New York State Fire Prevention Code."

SECTION II. PURPOSE

The purpose and intent of this ordinance is to provide for the adoption of the New York State Fire Prevention Code by the Town of New Scotland and to provide for the enforcement of the New York State Fire Prevention Code within the Town of New Scotland.

SECTION III. ENFORCEMENT

(a) Except as otherwise specifically provided by law, the Building Inspector of the Town of New Scotland and his deputies and assistants shall administer and enforce all of the provisions of the New York State Fire Prevention Code and shall serve as chief enforcement officer of the same.

New York State Fire Code

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(b) The chief of each of the four fire departments currently existing within the Town of New Scotland shall serve, and are hereby appointed, as fire inspectors, to serve as such within the boundaries of their individual fire districts. The fire inspectors shall be charged with the responsibility of reporting any and all violations of the Fire Prevention Code brought

to their attention within their fire districts to the enforcement officer for such action as he may deem necessary for the enforcement of said Code.

SECTION IV. PENALTIES FOR VIOLATIONS

In accordance with Section 391 of Article 18-A of the Executive Law of the State of New York:

(a) It shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to occupy, maintain, conserve, rehabilitate or renew any building, structure or premises as it relates to the safe-guarding of life and property therein and thereabout and to the hazards of fire, explosion or release of toxic gases arising from the storage, handling or use of combustible or hazardous substances, materials or devices, in violation of the rules and regulations set forth in the New York State Fire Prevention Code.

(b) Any person who shall fail to comply with a written order of the enforcement officer within the time fixed for compliance therewith shall be punishable by a fine of not to exceed \$100.00 or imprisonment of not to exceed thirty days or both. Each day that a violation continues shall be deemed a separate offense.

(c) Except as provided otherwise by law, such a violation shall not be a crime and the penalty or punishment imposed therefor shall not be deemed for any purpose a penal or criminal penalty or punishment.

SECTION V. ABATEMENT

Appropriate actions and proceedings may be taken at law or equity to restrain, correct or abate a violation of the Fire

Prevention Code or to prevent unsafe or illegal occupancy of a building, structure or premises and these remedies shall be in addition to penalties otherwise prescribed by law.

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
