Permitting certain materials to be enclosed with real property tax bills. Text

LOCAL LAW NO. 2 of 1985
for the TOWN OF NEW SCOTLAND

A Local Law permitting certain materials to be enclosed with real property tax bills.

BE IT ENACTED by the Town Board of the Town of New Scotland as follows:

SECTION I: The purpose of this law is to permit a notice concerning changes in the Town assessment calendar to be enclosed with the Town of New Scotland tax bill for the year 1985, pursuant to Section 5 of the Tax Law.

SECTION II: The tax collecting officer for the Town of New Scotland is hereby authorized to enclose with each property tax bill for the year 1986 sent to owners of real property in the Town of New Scotland a notice concerning changes in the assessment calendar in the same or substantially the same format as provided below:

Pursuant to recent State legislation, changes have been made in the real property tax assessment calendar for towns and cities in New York State.

1. The date by which applications for real property tax exemptions must be filed is now March 1.
2. The date for completion of the tentative assessment roll is now May 1.
3. The date by which complaints concerning tentative assessments must be filed and the date the board of assessment review will meet is the third Tuesday in May.
4. The date by which the final assessment roll must be filed is July 1.

For more information concerning these and other changes in assessment calendar, contact your assessor.

SECTION III: This local law shall be effective immediately upon filing with the Secretary of State.
